
The three tables of our life together

Our logo was inspired by the famous Rublev icon of the trinity a copy of which is above the bishop's throne in church.



The icon, written in the 15th century, is regarded as one of the highest achievements of Russian art. In it we see the three angels who visited Abraham at the Oak of Mamre, in the book Genesis, but the image is deeply symbolic and is interpreted as an icon of the Holy Trinity. At the time of Rublev, the Holy Trinity was the embodiment of spiritual unity, peace, harmony, mutual love and humility.

The fourth side of the table is left open, inviting us all into that relationship, with God, and with one another. We hope, we offer such and offering here.
